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This reflection paper concludes my takeaway points concerning what I learned from level four. Dr. Kevin Zadai said that if you're not careful in what you say, and if you're not careful concerning committing to making a decision, it may cause you to muddy up the waters of your life, regarding where you're supposed to be going. Because your tongue is a rudder, and you have to be careful what you commit to, because if you cannot commit to those things you may find yourself in some serious trouble down the road.

Unfortunately in the past, I have also found people that like to muddy up the waters of my faith in God's miracles. Therefore it is my professional opinion that we need to be careful, and not have any fellowship with those who are walking in unbelief in God, because their lack of faith will subtract from your faith and steal from you if you do not have proper healthy boundaries against unbelievers. The following Bible verse also applies to people who say their Christians but they don't believe—giving themselves the title of Christian unbelievers.

***“Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?”***

***2 Corinthians 6:14 (KJV)***

Additionally, Jesus had to clear out the house of Jairus because people's doubt and unbelief would hinder Him if he didn't. Which made those unbelievers a pack of thieves, which were eligible for God's judgment.

I unfortunately have been stolen from for so many years by Christian unbelievers in the modern-day church, and it got so bad, that the robbing of my miracles got so nasty, that I eventually had to pray for God to give me justice against them—onto the fourth generation of their houses.

These thieves fight the truth and want to live a lie, they don't want to hold themselves accountable and judge themselves, they want to get rid of the evidence of God's modern-day miracles and that's why they tried to kill Jesus and Lazarus after Jesus raised him from the dead.

In conclusion, Dr. Zadai made it very clear that whenever somebody says something we are not to react right away until we first and foremost hear first from God. Don't commit to anything if you're not sure if you're going to be able to do that. If God isn't saying anything, then we just don't do anything; and we should keep doing what we originally were supposed to be doing as planned.
