Some of my takeaway points in this level #1 group of sessions, made me reflect on the ways of The Lord and in God's personality. How God's character is part of his absolute truth. This is true because God always keeps His Word.

However, mankind is a whole other issue. The sad part of our fallen world is that when a man does not keep his word, he shows himself to be lacking in character and integrity. When a man breaks his word, not only can he not be trusted, but he creates a debt account with the people whose trust he violated, and after a time or a season goes by where he fails to show himself untrustworthy again, his grace period ends, causing him to be cast into collections by society's conscience, not knowing that he sold himself into slavery until his trust account in the people is restored.

“The rich rule over the poor, and the borrower is slave to the lender.”

Proverbs 22:7 (NIV)

Therefore it is my truthful opinion that when men refuse to love God and their neighbor as themselves they go into slavery and their deception makes them believe they could manipulate themselves out of every hard situation until judgment day comes and they realize they were wrong. This is why we should have the same character as God, to avoid being judged.
