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I loved this teaching for it was so profound for me because I know that God's Holy Word is true and that God did buy back healing for us (the body of Christ).

I recall a time several years ago at a church barbecue when I and another person in my small group were playing basketball and the man I was on the court with injured his leg. When I tried to encourage him by quoting scripture, "By His stripes, ye were healed." He snapped at me, while nursing his leg in pain, saying, 'It means spiritual healing, not physical healing— Anthony!" I didn't argue with him, I just walked away and let God deal with him; and a year later, it came to pass that his body was in a worse condition, after having some kind of surgery on his body, while his boss on the job was giving him a heavy merciless workload, his body was having a hard time healing itself.

Having mercy on him, I offered to pray over him in our small group, and he agreed, asking me to pray that God would speed up the healing process—which God did. A short time later, he won an arm wrestling contest, breaking another man's arm. And it later came to pass, that I felt the presence of an eight-foot-tall blue demon around him, and that demon somehow captivated his emotions with hatred toward me.

I am done with cessationists stinking up my community with unbelief, the same way a skunk stinks up a room. My prayer is for God to surround me with people who don't limit Him

with unbelief. People who don't believe in healing are like slippery eels, they're very slick to penetrate Christian social networks, acting like believers themselves, but they are the kind of individuals who snuff out healing movements before they can start; because of their electric toxins of unbelief spread out, and infests the hearts of others—like a virus in the air. Or like the Pharisees that put yokes on people instead of taking them off.

On a side note, I now understand that there has to be a hunger and desire in a person for healing and that they have to make some sort of effort toward God and me for prayer. I can see how Jesus wants people to express faith in Him first before their faith justifies them in receiving healing. For example, if I had five dollars and my neighbor needed it, I'd be violating his boundaries by giving that to him—if he didn't ask for it by faith. Believing I could give it to him, therefore God's ways are just in His healing methods. Because God respects the will of each person and would never violate any man's boundaries. As session #5 said, "Jesus is in full authority, but He doesn't push Himself on anybody."

I believe in healing, I believe in this teaching, and I also believe in being ruthless and viscous (with The Word of God) against any kind of sickness that would dare to try to attack my body. And as for being used by God to heal others, like people in crowds by the masses, I'm just going to have to be faithful, and let The Lord work with me where I'm at, so that God can raise me up to where he wants me to be. To Jesus be the glory.
