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There have been so many good topics that I learned from this course alone that it's going to be hard for me to pick and choose which was one of the best topics to write about, but with the grace of God in my life, I'll do my best and I'm sure He'll help me fill in the blanks where blanks need to be filled in the most.

I liked the topic of dealing with prophetic weirdos. From my standpoint, having gone to a cessationist church for almost 10 years now, I feel like a lot of my reflection papers have unfortunately been complaining about the cessationism in the pastors and leaders that have oppressed me and depressed me at my church. False leaders who were used by the kingdom of darkness against me.

On the other hand, in a way, it's also healthy to talk openly about how sometimes prophetic people do get a little weird and sometimes they think the universe revolves around them because they've had so many visions and prophetic experiences, and sometimes they just need to spiritually mature and realize that they need to grow up and learn how to become considerate toward others, loving God and their neighbors as themselves. But at the same time, I don't think it's right for prophetic people to grow alone, without a seer support group, they should be able to talk about the things that they have seen and heard (ref: Acts 4:20).

There were also other good teachings in this course which spoke about how dealing with law enforcement and dealing with people who want to confide in you and people who have broken the law, and how you need to get the law involved if they've done anything illegal.

There's a lot of stuff in there that's helpful where I kind of feel like the teachings in this course are preparing me to be a chaplain someday. That and perhaps a Bible teacher too.
